# **Budget Status Update:**

Vice President Hawley reported on the current budget status report ending July 31, 2023.

# **Capital Projects and Major Renovations:**

President Fore and Vice President Hawley reported on the following capital projects and major renovations:

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- **Conway Campus**: Renovation/Expansion of the Building 500 Cosmetology Labs. This renovation/expansion will also include taking over part of Building 600, the former Fowler Dining Room. Currently engaging architect for design.
- **Grand Strand Campus:** Renovation/Expansion of Building 100. Working on the Phase 1 design and cost estimates. Project expected to be complete in mid-2025.
- **Georgetown Campus**: Renovate/Upfit Buildings 100 and 500. Construction begins in June and should be completed by end of August and ready for fall classes.

## **Strategic Planning Kick-Off:**

Vice President Heafner announced August 17, 2023 is the new Strategic Plan Kick-Off with faculty and staff. As mentioned in prior meeting, the Strategic Plan is part of the College's planning process to plan the future direction of the college. Ms. Heafner shared a timeline of events beginning in August and ending in February with final draft being approved by the Area Commission.

### **Graduate Placement Report:**

Vice President Heafner reported the College's overall graduate placement rate is 95%.

## **Enrollment Comparison Update**

Vice President Batten reported the current overall fall Headcount is 6405. The overall FTE is 4256.3. We are now offering Zero tuition for 60 programs.
