programs have demonstrated steady growth over time, meeting the needs of our communities. For the current semester, there are 12% more dual enrolled students taking classes at HGTC when compared to Spring 2021. When compared to the Technical College System, HGTC ranks fourth out of 16 colleges in the number of dual enrollment students.

# In This "Line" of Work

#### HGTC Electrical Lineman Students Transition to Employment Opportunities with HTC


Ryan Embry was driving through the HGTC Conway Campus when he noticed numerous linemen climbing high on electrical poles. While his first reaction was that there had to be a serious electrical outage in the area, he soon learned those on the poles were all training for the College's Electrical Lineman Technician program. That, as he says, "sparked his interest" in finding out more about the program. The next thing Ryan knew, "I was out there climbing poles myself," he said.

For Cody Bullard, the path to that same Electrical Lineman Technician program was inspired by family ties, as he wanted to follow the lead of his uncle who was a lineman with Horry Electric Cooperative, Inc. Cody enrolled soon after his Aynor High School graduation. Ryan began the Electrical Lineman Technician program in his 30's following careers in the military, law enforcement field, and satellite television industry. While both Ryan and Cody arrived at the Electrical Lineman Technician program from different directions, ultimately those pathways led to the same place – a valuable employment opportunity with Horry Telephone Cooperative, Inc. (HTC).

Ryan cites the invaluable experience the faculty bring to this program.

"Professors Shoemaker and Vermeland had a level of compassion but were also able to reinforce that 'if you do that, you will hurt yourself.' Safety was the highest priority for them. They were able to give realworld examples of certain situations that would not be safe for lineman whether it be in working with telecommunications or electric companies," said Embry.





HGTC has been offering the Electrical Lineman Technician program since 2015. This concentrated one-semester, certificate program offers students classroom and field training in math, electrical circuit analysis, power systems, and transformer theory, as well as safety and climbing techniques.

Since inception, the Electrical Lineman Technician program has maintained capacity enrollment each term and boasts a high job placement rate, thanks to partnerships with community employers like HTC. The program has evolved into the largest, most expansive lineman training yard in the state now encompassing all necessary lineman disciplines (overhead distribution, underground distribution, and transmission overhead).

Both Ryan and Cody credit the HGTC Electrical Lineman Technician faculty in their training success. Professor Scott Shoemaker has been with the program since it was initiated after a 37-year career with Santee Cooper, 20 years of which were specifically focused on lineman training. Professor Robert Vermeland joined the Electrical Lineman Technician program in 2019 following 32 years as a Certified Lineman with Duke Energy.



Cody reinforces the impact of training with those who have been in the field.

"It's better to learn from someone who actually has been there hands-on and dealt with that type of work. They can give you information on that situation and what they have experienced. If you are confronted with a problem, they have been there," said Bullard.

The move from student life in the Electrical Lineman Technician program to working life at HTC was a natural shift for both Ryan and Cody. Ryan was recruited by HTC upon completing the Electrical Lineman Technician program in August 2021. After initially joining HTC as a Technology Intern in the Construction Department, he now acts as a Construction Worker involved in the installation and splicing of fiber optic lines

According to Embry, "It was a smooth transition from the classroom to the workforce because so much of the machinery we were learning to operate on the job was used in our training in the Electrical Lineman Technician program. The safety procedures between the Electrical Lineman Technician program and HTC also go hand in hand."

Cody also started at HTC as a Technology Intern immediately after receiving his certificate from the Electrical Lineman Technician program in the Fall of 2020. He has since progressed at HTC from working in a Construction Worker position to a Plant Technician position in the Installation and Repair Department. Cody also draws parallels between the Electrical Lineman Technician program training he received and his work at HTC.

"When I was in the construction training at HGTC, using the bucket truck was critical because I was actually in the bucket and installing lines. Today I am using the same equipment and tools that I learned to use in the Electrical Lineman Technician program. Already having that experience really made the transition to HTC easier," explained Bullard.

Ryan and Cody are just two of the many Electrical Lineman Technician program alumni who have applied their HGTC skills to real-world employment at HTC. The relationship between HGTC and HTC has been invaluable to our students' successes.

Professor Scott Shoemaker applauds the partnership with HTC. "HTC, the largest communications cooperative in the nation, has been an industry partner since the Electrical Lineman Technician program started in January 2015. Their relationship with the Electrical Lineman Technician program professors and students not only strengthens the program but also provides the most technically and physically capable candidates. HTC is in regular communication with the Electrical Lineman Technician program faculty and students to enhance future careers in their company," said Shoemaker.

Craig Johnson, Director of Construction Services at HTC, also sees the benefit of the partnership.

"HTC is proud to partner with HGTC and this certificate program that prepares graduates to enter the utility industry. The program provides a broad understanding of the skills, knowledge, safe work practices and physical ability required to perform line work," said Johnson.

Based on his own journey from HGTC to HTC, Cody offered encouragement for anyone considering enrollment in the Electric Lineman Technician program.

"If you like working with your hands, it would be an excellent trade to pursue. It's an outstanding program where you learn a lot of real-world situations. HGTC prepares you really well," said Bullard.







HGTC Hosts Successful Community Open House

HGTC hosted a successful Community Open House event at the James R. Frazier Community Center on Tuesday, February 22. The community was invited to attend and learn more about the educational grant funding approved by Horry County Government provided through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The Bucksport, Toddsville, and Bucksville areas of Horry County now have easier access to the job training programs offered by HGTC through the Bucksport community education program.

"We are very excited about the grant funding available from Horry County for those who live in the Bucksport community and surrounding areas. There are many tuition-free programs available for various career paths and life-changing opportunities for residents who will take advantage of classes as they prepare for a better future," said Dr. Marilyn Murphy Fore, HGTC President.

The community education program in the Bucksport area will use around \$1.9 million to bring certain job skill courses to community members, either via online courses or at the James R. Frazier Community Center. The first portion of spending will be used to complete a survey of community members to determine what courses the program should offer and who might be interested in taking the courses. The second portion of spending will pay for class equipment at the community center and will pay for community members to complete the training programs offered. Some of the programs available through HGTC funding include:

- Commercial Driver's License (CDL)
- Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)
- Certified Crane Operator

- Culinary & Baking
- Drone Training
- Emergency Medical Technology Basic (EMT)
- Heavy Equipment Operator

### **FINANCE**

#### STIMULUS FUNDING AND FREE TUITION



- In February 2022, the College filed for and received an extension for using its Higher Education Emergency Relief (HEERF) Stimulus funding. As a result, these funds have been dedicated to providing tuition assistance to students throughout the spring, summer, and fall 2022 semesters. During these semesters, students who have completed their FAFSA and are enrolled in three or more credit hours will not incur any tuition costs. Since 2020 students have been provided approximately \$14.0 million in COVID-related assistance and support through HEERF.
- In March, the College disbursed approximately \$5,137,000 in payments directly to students as part of the HEERF legislation. For the Spring semester, students that were Pell eligible received \$1,150 and non-Pell eligible students received \$650.

## CAPITAL PROJECTS AND MAJOR RENOVATIONS

HGTC is continuing with its plans for building new and renovating existing facilities and campus infrastructures. The College has:

- Completed the exterior renovations and landscaping/infrastructure improvements on the Grand Strand Campus. These improvements totaled approximately \$9.3 million. A ceremony to re-dedicate the Grand Strand Campus is scheduled for April 22nd.
- Developed plans for replacing the HVAC systems on all three campuses including new units in Conway Building 1100 and Georgetown Building 100.
- Established plans for resurfacing the roads and parking lots in Conway and Georgetown over the coming summer months.
- Begun renovating its new Diesel Engine Technician training facility located in the Atlantic Center across from the Conway campus. The renovations are projected to be \$2,400,000 and will establish a stateof-the art training facility and will enable the program's enrollment to more than double.
- Begun work renovating and expanding the Surgical Technology area in the Speir Building on the Grand Strand Campus.











#### **MARKETING**

#### FREE TUITION FOR SPRING, SUMMER & FALL 2022

The Marketing Department has been busy getting the word out to the community about free tuition costs for the Spring, Summer, & Fall 2022 semesters. The team has changed its entire messaging to focus on free tuition costs. The campaign includes outdoor digital boards, signage, social media, website banner rotations, new web pages, and print materials. Marketing is in the process of producing an April & May mailer that will be sent to Horry & Georgetown County households with 16-year-olds to 55-year-olds. In addition, all three Chambers of Commerce have sent email blasts to their membership and business lists. Marketing is also working closely with the Admissions Department to send current and prospective students email messages and a postcard mailing. Because of a combined effort across the College, from the Finance Office to Recruitment, the free tuition message is being well received by the public.
